**2010 RULEBOOK SUPPLEMENT**

Section III, Part 2, A page 39

Add to end of paragraph: There will be no penalty for late renewal of membership.

Section III, Part 2, D page 39

Delete:

Non-members may participate in ASPC/AMHR recognized shows on the condition that the non-member shall comply with all rules governing such shows, including but not limited to the rules contained herein and all rules that are applicable to the particular show in question.

Add:

Non-members may participate in ASPC/AMHR recognized shows (with the exception of the AMHR National and the ASPC Congress shows) on the condition that the non-member shall comply with all rules governing such shows, including but not limited to the rules contained herein and all rules that are applicable to the particular show in question.

Section III, Part 3, A, Page 39

Add to end of paragraph: Non-members submitting registrations and/or transfers for ASPC/AMHR/ASPR animals will be charged double the regular registration and/or transfer fee.

Section III, Part 3, A Page 39

Add:

1. Animals obtained by legal seizure, where a registration certificate and/or transfer is not obtained from the owner of record, must be brought before the Board of Directors and only in cases where there is clear proof of ownership and clear identification of the animal will a transfer of ownership be allowed.

Section III, Part 3, I page 41

Add to end of paragraph: There will be no registry fee for stallion to gelding certificate changes.

Section III, Part 3, K, Page 41

Add to end of Paragraph: A owner has one year from date of birth of a horse to make sure his/her papers are correct in regard to gender. After that one year, he/she cannot apply for a change from stallion to mare or mare to stallion.

Section III, Part 14, P, Page 60

Add to end of paragraph: A show may not employ more than one AMHR National Judge and one ASPC Congress Judge of the current show year at each show that they hold.

Section III, Part 22, Page 70

Add as second paragraph: Offspring of a horse registered as a American Show Pony that is bred to mares with German registered parents whose offspring are not qualified to be Shetland registered will not be allowed to be registered in the International Shetland registry.

Section IV, Part 2, H Page 76

Add: 4d. The AMHR National Show shall have three judges for Open Halter Classes and three different judges for Open Performance Classes.

Section IV, Part 2, G Page 76

Add: 4. Judge pool for ASPR and Modern ponies may be expanded by recognizing guest judges at the Congress and the Ohio State Fair.

Section VII, Part 13, C, 3, Page 132

Delete: b. Entries to shown barefoot or with an evenly weighted appropriate size, light plate of uniform thickness and weight (light pads are optional).

Add: b. Entries are to be shown barefoot or with a evenly weighted shoe of uniform thickness and an optional light pad. Caulks and trailers allowed on hind shoes. Toe clips and/or side clips are permitted. No artificial attachments such as lead chunks, weights, rings, etc are allowed. Artificial appliances (rubber bands, chains, shackles, etc..) are prohibited in the ring or warm up area at the horse show.

Section VII, Part 13, C 3 Page 133

Delete: g. Each entry will be individually worked off the rail, on a line, either across the show ring or parallel to the rail, wall or fence.

Add: g. Ponies are to enter the ring and line up in the location

indicated by the ringmaster. After being examined by the judges, ponies are to walk to the rail and work both ways at the trot. Ponies are then to line back up in the location indicated by the ring master for final inspection. Amended to read "working on the rail is optional".

#### Section VII, Part 13, D, Page 135

##### Delete:

1. Open Modern Formal Pleasure Pony Driving class to be judged 40% on conformation and 60% on manners, quality and performance. Pony to be shown to a suitable two-wheeled cart with foot basket or four-wheeled vehicle, but not a viceroy, racing sulky or fine harness rig. Pony to be judged on an easy animated, but not extreme way of going. Pony to be shown barefoot or with a keg shoe, light pads optional, with no weights. No artificial attachments to shoe or hoof (lead chunks, weights); toe clips and side clips are permitted. Artificial appliances are prohibited in the ring or warm up area at the horse show: chains, rubber bands and shackles. The Modern Pleasure driving pony must wear a show-type harness, including side or overchecks, square or round blinkers with straight or broken snaffle bit. A properly fitted cavesson or nose band is required. Check bit and martingales are optional. No Liverpool bits, curb chains or curb straps are allowed. There should be light contact with the mouth, slight flexion at the poll without evidence of undue restraint. The pony should be relatively high headed and have a free way of moving. The check rein should not interfere with the relaxed and free way of going. Ponies are to enter the ring to the right and be shown both ways of the ring at the "Walk", "Pleasure Trot" and "Extended Trot". Excessive speed and extreme action are to be penalized. The "Walk" should be a relaxed flatfooted walk, a four beat straight movement and not a jog trot. The "Pleasure Trot" should be easy going, square with elasticity and freedom of movement. The "Extended Trot" should be ground covering, open and reaching. Ponies are to line up in the center of the ring, stand quietly and back readily. Driver to be dressed in appropriate attire (not silks or colors). Attendant optional (except in youth class). The optional header (except in Youth classes) must stand two paces back from the pony's head and is not allowed to touch the animal except for safety purposes. It is imperative that ponies stand quietly, back readily, and return to the lineup. Ponies shown in pleasure driving not eligible for any other driving division.

##### Add:

1. Open Modern Formal Pleasure Pony Driving class to be judged 40% on conformation and 60% on manners, quality and performance. Artificial appliances (rubber bands, chains, shackles, etc.,) are prohibited in the ring or warm up area at the horse show. The Modern Pleasure driving pony must wear a show-type harness, including side or overchecks, square or round blinkers with straight or broken snaffle bit. A properly fitted cavesson or nose band is required. Check bit and martingales are optional. No Liverpool bits, curb chains or curb straps are allowed. There should be light contact with the mouth, slight flexion at the poll without evidence of undue restraint. The pony should be relatively high headed and have a free way of moving. The checkrein should not interfere with the relaxed and free way of going. Ponies are to enter the ring to the right and be shown both ways of the ring at the "Walk", "Pleasure Trot" and "Extended Trot". Excessive speed and extreme action are to be penalized. The "Walk" should be a relaxed flatfooted walk, a four beat straight movement and not a jog trot. The "Pleasure Trot" should be easy going, square with elasticity and freedom of movement. The "Extended Trot" should be ground covering, open and reaching. Ponies are to line up in the center of the ring, stand quietly and back readily. Driver to be dressed in appropriate attire (not silks or colors). Attendant optional (except in youth class). The optional header (except in Youth classes) must stand two paces back from the pony's head and is not allowed to touch the animal except for safety purposes. It is imperative that ponies stand quietly, back readily, and return to the lineup. Ponies shown in pleasure driving not eligible for any other driving division..

#### Section VII, Part 13, E, Page 137

Delete: Country Pleasure Pony to be shown barefoot or with an evenly weighted appropriate size, light plate of uniform thickness and weight without pad. Shoe may weigh no more than 6 oz. excluding nails. Cross-entering between Modern Formal Pleasure Pony and Modern Country Pleasure Pony classes will not be allowed at the same show.

Add: Entries are to be shown barefoot or with a evenly weighted shoe of uniform thickness and an optional light pad with a combined weight of no more than 9 ounces, excluding nails. Toe clips and/or side clips are permitted. No artificial attachments such as lead chunks, weights, rings, etc are allowed. Artificial appliances (rubber bands, chains, shackles, etc.,) are prohibited in the ring or warm up area at the horse show.

Section X, Part 2 A, page 241

Delete:

A. All AMHR shows, including the National Show, are open only to horses registered with the AMHR. No animal will be allowed to show or be officially measured at an approved ASPC/AMHR show unless the exhibitor can show the original registration paper or a photostatic copy of the same to the show management and/or Steward. (no registration papers, no official measurement, no showing) All horses shown at the AMHR National Show must have been registered with the AMHR at least 60 days prior to the opening date of the National Show (exception foals of current year). All horses will be measured at the National Show.

Add:

A. All AMHR shows, including the National Show, are open only to horses registered with the AMHR. No animal will be allowed to show or be officially measured at an approved ASPC/AMHR show unless the exhibitor can show the original registration paper or a photostatic copy of the same to the show management and/or Steward. (no registration papers, no official measurement, no showing) All horses shown at the AMHR National Show must have been registered with the AMHR at least 60 days prior to the closing date of entries of the National Show (exception foals of current year). All horses will be measured at the National Show.

Section X, Page 264 and 265

Delete: Part 17 – Draft Harness Horses

- A. Classes: In the draft harness division, classes may be offered for singles, pairs, tandem, unicorns, four-, six and eight-in-hand.
- B. Horses must be shown hitched to a suitable 4 wheeled vehicle, except that a cart may be used for single or tandem.
- C. All horses must be harnessed with heavy harness (collar with full hames and breeching). The wagon and/or harness may display the owners name, advertising, logo, monograms etc.
- D. Horses to be shown both ways of the ring at a natural walk and trot. Horses to stand quietly and back readily, will be worked in a figure eight, and gee and haw. Docking is optional and tandem and unicorn to be worked at Judge's discretion. Headers (16 years of age and older) may be used for safety.

E. Draft driving classes may be divided in the same fashions in the pleasure driving division.

F. In the draft harness division, braiding of tails and manes in the style used by the larger heavy harness breeds may be used. Shoeing and bits similar to the type used by the larger heavy harness breeds are permissible.

Add: Part 17 – Draft Harness Driving Horses

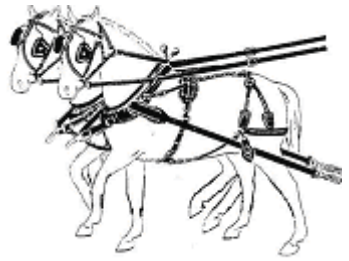
A. General: Utilitarian (usefulness over beauty) is stressed for miniature horses, harness and wagon. Clipping of fetlocks is optional. The foot must be natural. Horses are to be judged 60% on manners (in motion and rest) and useful performance, 20% on appointments (draft type equipment), and 20% on breed type, suitability and conformation. Fancy equipment is not to count over a neat, clean and suitable working outfit. Draft vehicles and/or tack may have names on them.

1. Draft miniature horses may be shown barefoot or with a light plate shoe or a draft type shoe with toe and heel caulks. Pads may be used, but any additional weight of any description is prohibited.

2. Draft miniature horses to be shown to a four-wheeled dray (freight) type wagon (as similar to the large draft horse wagons). See photo insert. The hitch wagon may have wooden wheels or rubber tires. Buggies are not appropriate. A cart may be used for singles.



3. Harness must be of the heavy draft type with breeching, full collars, full hames and appropriate bit suitable for heavy draft type harness. See insert(s).



4. No one may assist the driver in any way (except in the event of an accident), but, passengers are permitted.

5. A lead tongue is optional on lead teams. Usefulness is emphasized.

6. Headers (16 years of age and older) are required in Youth Draft Classes. Riding attendants are optional in Youth Draft Classes, but they must be sixteen (16) years old or older for safety reasons.

7. All draft harness classes are considered mini cart classes (ie: each horse in a multiple hitch shall be given an entry number and they must be displayed on vehicle or driver) and all are qualifying classes for the Draft Harness Stake Class.

B. Ring Procedure: Horses to be shown both ways of the ring at a working trot and a flat footed walk without undue restraint. Single draft harness horses shall be asked to halt (or line up) stand quietly and back readily. Multiple hitch classes will then be asked to line up along the rail and perform their individual maneuvers in this order: work a figure eight, walk up to judge (call judge), swing gee and haw, back quietly, and stand quietly. Docking is optional. Tandem and unicorn are to be worked at the judge's discretion. When the last hitch has done their maneuvers, entrants shall line up side by side for judge(s) to mark their cards.

Section X, Page 265

ADD: Part 18-1 AMHR Light Harness Driving

A. Classes may be offered for pairs, tandems, unicorns, four-in-hand, six-in-hand, 4 abreast, etc.

B. Gait Requirements: Hitches are to enter the show ring at a trot going counter-clockwise (to the right). The horses should be judge at the flat footed walk, trot and extended trot both ways of the ring. The walk should be a relaxed flatfooted walk, a four beat straight movement and easy going. The extended trot should be ground covering and reaching. Extreme animation is to be penalized. Horses should be asked to stand quietly in the line up and rein back at the discretion of the Judge.

C. Horses must be harnessed in light harness with breast collar, full collar, (not full hames). Britching is permitted. Harness may have side check or over-check. Liverpool bits are not allowed. Check bit and martingales are optional.

D. Vehicle should be two wheeled (meadow-brook type), or four

wheeled buggy, buckboard type or antique carriage. No viceroys, racing sulkies, or fine harness rigs allowed.

E. Exhibitors shall not be allowed to wear formal type wear (evening gowns or tuxedos). Casual or western type wear is appropriate, hats may or may not be worn, but all clothing should be appropriate to the type of vehicle that is being used.

F. Judging to be based 70% on way of going, 20% on equipment & harness, 10% on conformation.

Section X, Part 31, C Page 292

Delete:

2. In order to show at the National Show all horses must have been shown at sanctioned AMHR Shows under four approved Judges at two or more locations. Shows held at the same location must have five days between each show in order for each show at the location to be a qualifying show for the AMHR National Show. The National Area Show counts as three approved Judges. Each set of points awarded at the show count as a Judge. (Example: the National Area Show has three sets of points so shall count as a three Judge show; likewise the National show has five sets of points so shall count as five Judges). The show qualification shall be from the date of the preceding National Show to the date of the National Show entered. Verification for shows within 21 days of the National Show is the responsibility of the owner/agent. The preceding National Show shall not count as a qualifying show. Foals of the current year are not required to qualify for the National Show.

Add:

2. In order to show at the National Show all horses must have been shown at sanctioned AMHR Shows under four approved Judges at two or more locations. Shows held at the same location must have five days between each show in order for each show at the location to be a qualifying show for the AMHR National Show. Exception: Two clubs hosting different shows and using 2 different sets of judges at the same location on consecutive days. The National Area Show counts as three approved Judges. Each set of points awarded at the show count as a Judge. (Example: the National Area Show has three sets of points so shall count as a three Judge show; likewise the National show has five sets of points so shall count as five Judges). The show qualification shall be from the date of the preceding National Show to the date of the National Show entered. Verification for shows within 21 days of the National Show is the responsibility of the owner/agent. The preceding National Show shall not count as a qualifying show. Foals of the current year are not required to qualify for the National Show. Mares exhibiting in the AMHR Mare and Current Year Foal class do not have to qualify for AMHR Nationals. However, mare may not show in any other class at Nationals unless qualified.

Section X, Part 31, C Page 294

Add as a last sentence to C #6:

Youth do not have to qualify a current year foal in order to show that foal at the AMHR Nationals.

Add: 7. In order to exhibit at the AMHR Nationals, all exhibitors must

Add: As last line of first paragraph on page 299:  
Western Country Pleasure and Country Pleasure classes for divisions A & B will be added to the Futurity starting with foals born in 2009. Classes will start in 2012.

Section XII, Part 1, Page 320

Delete:

G. Show Management: It is the hope of the National Area Show Committee that an area show will move around within the geographical confines of an area to make it more accessible. Show management may consist of one person, a group of people, organization, area club, etc. Upon the awarding of a National Area Show, it shall become the responsibility of the show management physically and financially to put on the show. Bid priority for site locations will be given to ASPC/AMHR/ASPR affiliated clubs in good standing, over private enterprise entities. Affiliated clubs awarded bids will be eligible for show ribbons supplied by the National Office. Private enterprise awarded bids will be fully responsible for ribbons and all other monetary expenditures incurred for the show. The ASPC/AMHR is not responsible for any other financial assistance to the show. New proposals must be submitted each year.

Add:

G. It is the hope of the National Area Show Committee that an area show will move around within the geographical confines of an area to make it more accessible to all members with in the area. A bid for an Area Show can be from a sanctioned or recognized club, organization, a group

of people or one person that is a current member of the ASPC/AMHR registry and has hosted an ASPC/AMHR show in the previous year. Show management may consist of a sanctioned or recognized club consisting of ASPC/AMHR members, officers of the club, by-laws and a mission statement shall be on file with the National office, or an organization, a group of people, or one person.

Upon the awarding of a National Area Show, it shall become the responsibility of the sanctioned or recognized club, organization, group of people, or one person to be physically and financially responsible to present the Area Show granted to them.

Only sanctioned or recognized ASPC/AMHR clubs will be awarded complimentary ribbons from the National office. All others will be financially responsible for ribbons. The ASPC/AMHR is not responsible for any other financial assistance to the awarded Area Show.

Bids for Area Shows must be submitted yearly.

Bid priority for site locations will be given to ASPC/AMHR sanctioned or recognized clubs in good standing, over an organization, group of people or one person.

an "A" show and shall award five times the All-Star points. The National Area Shows are always "A" rated shows and shall award triple All-Star points. Any State or local fair that includes all ASPC/AMHR/ASPR division classes as required by the Fair Class List, along with having a licensed ASPC/AMHR licensed judge/steward for said show, will be awarded one set of triple All Star points. This will be awarded to one State or local fair per year with the State Fair given priority. The Fair Required Class list is available from the Home Office upon request. Applications for a triple points fair show to be submitted to the ASPC/AMHR/ASPR home office. Applications must be submitted by March 1 for the upcoming show year. Submission deadline is suspended for 2010 show year. The National Area Show Committee shall award the triple point show for each state.

C. 2. An Amateur-owner/animal team may be paid first place prize money at any one area show only once and at the Congress or National show only once.

C. 3. An amateur-owner/animal team may compete at more than one area show. They may also compete more than once at the Congress or National Show but may not win first place prize money more than one time.

C. 2. All leased horses, in order to show in Amateur Incentive classes, must be in the Lessee's name by January 1 of the current show year. This rule will go into effect for the 2010 show year.

C. 3. An amateur-owner/animal team may compete at more than one area show. They may also compete more than once at the Congress or National Show.
