This program was established for those amateurs that are members of the ASPC/AMHR but don't have a desire to be in a show ring. This program allows those amateurs to exhibit their Shetlands and Miniatures thru other venues and earn their amateur awards including a amateur jacket as a Supreme Amateur in the Amateur Companion/Excellence program.

To participate, you must hold a current (2010) Amateur card and the Miniatures and Shetlands must be registered with the ASPC/AMHR. This part of the program differs from the regular amateur program as the points are accrued from level to level and they don't expire at the end of each year, you can use multiple equines to earn your points which will help you build them faster and you can win as many consecutive awards as you like.

This part of the packet includes those recording forms. You may turn them in at any time to your coordinator, Ms. Janice Bryant. If you have any questions please don't hesitate to call or drop and email.

ASPC/AMHR/ASPR Amateur Excellence Program

The following is a list of activities that you may participate in with your pony/horse (mandatory that your registered pony/horse is involved) and receive recognition. You must participate in a minimum of three different categories; one **must** be a local show. All participants **must** hold a **valid** ASPC/AMHR/ASPR Amateur Card. The Amateur Excellence form must be properly filled out and signed by either the coordinator, a supervisor, the President of the club, the show manager/secretary (signature can not be the individual program participant). The form can be submitted at any time (when reached an award (s) goal) and multiple forms can be submitted throughout the program or you may hold them and turn it in when you obtain your points down to the jacket and all patches and jacket will be sent at the same time.

Activities and Point Value:

Parades- 5 points per horse, 10 points per driving horse, 10 points per costume

CDE Event- 10 points for each event

Precision Drills-10 points for each competition entered

Exhibition at County Fairs or Breed Showcase events -10 points per horse

Open Shows- (Non Sanctioned) – 5 points per horse

(Enclose a class sheet with added mini or pony classes) – 20 points total bonus

Local Shows- (Not including Area and National Shows) - 3 points

Convalescent Visits- (Nursing Homes, Hospitals, Children's Homes, etc) –3 points

Club/Group Activities- (Clinics, Trail Rides/Drives, Seminars, Fun Shows, etc.) –5 pts

School Demonstrations- 3 points per horse

4-H donated horses and ponies-15 points per horse

TV Broadcast, Newspaper Articles, Billboards, Magazine Articles (excluding breed publications)-10 points per horse

ASPC/AMHR/ASPR Amateur Companion Horse Program

This program is designed to reward those ponies/horses that have been used in the Amateur Excellence Program. When a pony or horse reaches 70 points, from the activities and values below, it will receive a certificate of achievement.

Activities and Point Value:

Parades- 5 points each parade

CDE Event- 5 points for each event

Precision Drills- 5 points for each competition entered

Exhibition- 3 points each exhibition

Open Shows- (Non Sanctioned) – 1point each show

Local Shows- (Not including Area and National Shows) –3 points

Convalescent Visits- (Clinics, Trail Rides/Drives, Seminars, Fun Shows, etc) –2pts
